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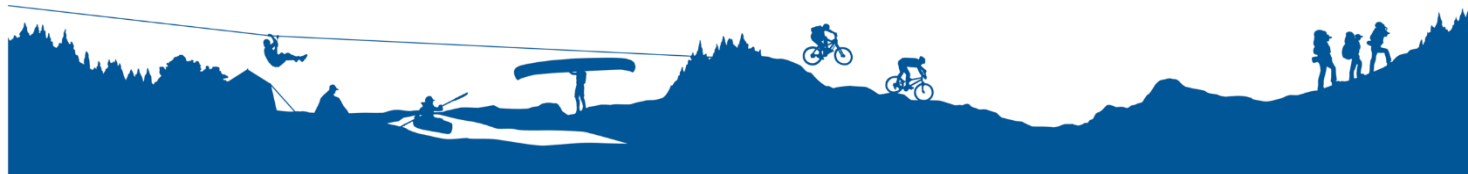


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Information Subject to Change

Youth Protection Online

Piedmont Council, BSA takes our responsibility for the welfare of the youth very seriously. Every adult working with a Scout must be registered as a Merit Badge Counselor with the BSA and have current Youth Protection Training. Every camp staff member completes current BSA Youth Protection Training.

Youth Protection Procedures

The BSA established “barriers to abuse” to ensure the safety of Scouts which all Scouts and leaders are expected to follow:

- All youth protection policies apply in an online environment. Two-deep leadership applies for all online activities and meetings. The ban on one-on-one contact between an adult leader and youth applies to all interactions-including in person, online, web conferences, over the phone, via text, or in any other form.
- All aspects of the Scouting program are open to observation by parents or guardians
- Use business-oriented conference platforms: Zoom, Skype, and GoToMeeting
Examples of platforms that are NOT recommended: Discord, Roblox, and Twitch.
- Please review the BSA Digital Privacy and Social Media Guidelines. We also suggest parents consider reviewing the terms of service, safety and privacy features, and data collection policies of Zoom. <https://zoom.us/docs/en-us/privacy-and-security.html>.
- Please review the terms of service, safety and privacy features, and data collection policies of any platform you use, and review the ***BSA Digital Privacy and Social Media Guidelines***.
- **Do not record online activities/meetings involving youth**
- Call recording is subject to various legal requirements under U.S. law and the laws of individual states, some of which require all parties to a call consent to recording. Considering those potential regulatory risks, ***the BSA does not authorize the recording of online meetings/activities.***

Today's youth are spending more time than ever using digital media for education, research, socializing, and fun. To help families and volunteers keep youth safe while online, the Boy Scouts of America introduces the Cyber Chip. In developing this exciting new tool, the BSA teamed up with content expert NetSmartz®, part of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children® and training expert for many law enforcement agencies.

The Cyber Chip can be earned by any youth in the BSA's programs. Material is tailored at each level for age-appropriateness.

- Cub Scouts—Grades 1-5 and 4-6
- Boy Scouts, Venturing Scouts, and Sea Scouts—Grades 6-10 and 8-10

Topics include cyberbullying, cell phone use, texting, blogging, gaming, and identity theft.

TO UNIT LEADERS

The Cyber Chip is available to youth earning merit badges. The Cyber Chip can be used as a tool to track and a commitment to the Scout Oath in the same way. Merit and leaders will be issuing the Cyber Chip based on youth's activities and progress. This is a reward and a tool to use on the Scout Oath.

Piedmont Council Safety Precautions

Piedmont Council, BSA is committed to the safety of all scouts. We will use the additional procedures to protect all Scouts while using Zoom.

- Use unique meeting identification numbers for each merit badge session
- Utilize password features for all meetings
- Not publish meeting invitations via public forums and remind attendees not to pass along invitations.
- Disable features for participants such as screen sharing, chats, raise hand, and whiteboards.
- Moderators are trained to remove anyone not adhering to the Scouts code of conduct
- Personal information will not be shared via the zoom platform except that the youth's parent or guardian or the unit leadership responsible for tracking advancements.

Scout Code of Conduct

The following are guidelines for participating in virtual merit badge sessions in lieu of personal face-to-face instruction due to special circumstances. Each circumstance should be considered by the Council Advancement Committee and unit leader.

As A Scout:

- I agree that for me to begin a merit badge in a virtual setting, I must request my unit leader's permission
- I agree that I will only work and connect with the merit badge counselor virtually with my parents' permission
- I agree that when communicating with my virtual merit badge counselor I will ALWAYS ensure at least one other adult is present in all communications
- I understand that if a requirement uses words like "show," "demonstrate," or "discuss," I agree that I must be prepared to exhibit those requirements through the submission of a completed merit badge workbook
- I promise that I will not abuse the privilege that I have been given to participate in a merit badge virtual setting. I will not bully any scout that may be in a virtual setting with me, and understand that if I do so this privilege will be revoked and I will not be allowed to continue in this setting and I will not receive a refund for this class

The Order of the Arrow

The Order of the Arrow was founded by Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carrol A. Edson in 1915 at the Treasure Island Camp of the Philadelphia Council, BSA. It was approved as part of the Scouting program in 1934. For over 100 years, the Order of the Arrow has recognized Scouts and Scouters who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives. This recognition provides encouragement for others to live these ideals as well. Arrowmen are known for maintaining camping traditions and spirit, promoting year-round and long-term resident camping, and providing cheerful service to others. OA service, activities, adventures, and training for youth and adults are models of quality leadership development and programming that enrich and help to extend Scouting to America's youth.

The Role of Eswau Huppeday Lodge

The Eswau Huppeday lodge plays a crucial role in the summer camp experience at Camp Bud Schiele. During the non-summer months, the lodge provides a labor force to make sure camp is set up and ready for the summer camp. The lodge over the past several years has made major improvements to the camp property.

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Participant Reservations and Refunds

Virtual Trading Post:

- Patches – This years “Pass the Torch” participant patch may be purchased for \$5.00 at our online Trading Post (limited supply of patches are available).

Participant Class Fees:

- Class fees are \$10.00 per online class. You may participate in up to SIX classes per week. In addition, a Scout may participate in all four weeks if he/she chooses.

Participant Additional Class Fees:

- Some classes require additional materials to complete some of the requirements for the badge. A separate \$20.00 fee for materials, shipping and handling will be added to that class.
- All purchased materials will be shipped to your home via 3-day Priority US Mail.
- Additional information about fees are in the program section of this guide.

Merit Badge Partial Completions:

- Some classes will receive partials as in person requirements will need to be done by your local merit badge counselor. This is no different than classes offered in past summers at our camp. Camp Bud Schiele will offer weekend opportunities later this fall for some merit badges to be completed at camp. Pricing, schedules, and opportunities will be posted later once our current Covid-19 restrictions are lifted and additional guidance is provided from the state of North Carolina.
- A SEPARATE FEE WILL BE CHARGED FOR THE IN-PERSON WEEKENDS.

Hybrid Classes

This summer we will deliver a Virtual Summer Camp to our Scouts. We will be using summer camp staff both on camp property and from their homes to provide you with a full camping experience. We know some merit badge requirements will need to be completed in person such as our shooting sports merit badges. We are arranging to offer weekends at our camp for you to come and complete your requirements by showing safe gun handling and to complete the shooting qualifications for completion. We are also looking at offering a weekend of aquatics merit badges for you to enjoy. Check on our website for future dates, times, and cost for these weekends. For those of you who are in another state you can check with your council shooting sports committees for merit badge counselors who can help you complete the requirements. We look forward to having you join us this summer and again this fall for a memorable summer camp experience.

Just for Leaders and Parents

Camp Bud Schiele realizes that without the leaders and parents there would be no Scouts attending summer camp. Therefore, we have developed a program for leaders that is both fun and beneficial.

Scoutmaster Merit Badge for Adult Leaders

- We strive to keep our youth safe in this new world of online merit badges. In order to provide two deep leadership, we are reaching out to adults over the age of 18 to help us as moderators for our online classes. The job of the moderator is to be an additional adult online and to help us provide additional supervision in our online classes. You must know how to use a computer and we can train you on how to use the ZOOM software. Should you be available to help during a class period or during a class period over multiple days please let us know as soon as possible.
- A *limited-edition* Scoutmaster Merit Badge patch will be provided to any adult who moderates for 1 class for the entire week (1 hr. per day for 4 days). You will receive 1 patch for each class that you moderate. These patches will not be available for sale. Please contact us as soon as possible so we may start assigning you to a class.
- Scoutmaster Merit Badge patches are limited and will not be available for sale to the public.

Online Registration

Our goal at Camp Bud Schiele has always been to make registration easy and efficient for everyone attending. This year we are once again using Tentaroo for online registration. Listed below is a copy of what is on our website...

Registration will start on June 9, 1:00 p.m. You can register by picking a week. This will guide you to login to your individual account designed for parents. (If you don't have an account, create an individual account with parents contact information.)

1. After you have created your account, login and go to Manage Group on right hand side. Add youth by entering your scout(s) information here.
2. Click on Events, then click on Virtual Camp Bud Schiele, then choose the week that works for you.
3. Add your participant
4. Choose the class(es) that accommodate your scout's schedule the best.
5. You can pay online. (a 2.5% bank fee will be added)

Virtual Summer Camp Program

While we may not be able to do things at camp physically, the staff at Camp Bud Schiele are excited to bring many traditions to our participating Scouts virtually. These events will take place on our Facebook page, Instagram, Zoom, and other platforms that are conducive to the event. Pay attention to the social media pages and the camp webpage for times and updates and remember all activities are Eastern Standard Time.

Camping in Your Backyard

Scouts are encouraged to spend the week camping in their backyard! What if you do not have backyard or a place to set up a tent? Consider setting up a small tent in your house or bedroom and campout for the week. The National Office of the BSA has approved backyard camping for virtual summer camp to count towards your camping nights for rank advancement.

Assemblies

Every morning and evening, we will conduct flag assemblies. The staff will provide announcements, words of wisdom, and pertinent points of program. Although not required, class A should be worn at evening assemblies. Morning assemblies will happen at 9am. Evening assemblies happen at 6:45pm.

Scavenger Hunt

Throughout the week, you can participate in a scavenger hunt. Each day, you will be given a list of items to find. You can find them in your home or during your live merit badge sessions. Photos must be taken. No Google photos! See who gets the most at the end of the week.

Coffee Clutch

During the week, leaders or parents can join in on a Zoom meeting to discuss about the virtual program and suggest ideas for the 2021 program. So, brew a cup of coffee and prepare for a conversation about the future of Camp Bud Schiele. These will happen Monday and Thursday at 9am for any questions or concerns you may have.

Lunch with the CBS Staff

Every day at 12:40PM Scouts can enjoy lunch with one of our Camp Bud Schiele Staff members as they share “why they love Camp Bud Schiele” and highlight one of our program areas.

Opening Campfire

Sunday night, the staff will perform skits, songs, and take the time to introduce themselves and the merit badges they will be teaching for the week. Campfire will begin at 8pm.

Movie Night

Tuesday nights at Camp Bud Schiele are traditionally Movie Night. On Tuesday’s at CBS Scouts can order Pizza from a local restaurant from our camp trading post and enjoy pizza and a movie with their fellow scouts. In addition, the Hawaiian Ice truck also visits camp and Scouts can purchase a shaved ice treat that is sure to cool you down on those hot summer days. Scouts are encouraged to enjoy Pizza and a Movie with their families on Tuesday night during virtual summer camp.

Trivia Night

Tuesday night gather your family team or play our trivia challenge as an individual. Questions will cover topics like Scouting, video games, and who knows what else. This will take place on Zoom and answers will be submitted on Google forms. Trivia will start at 7:00pm.

Cobbler Bakeoff

Just because you are not at camp does not mean that leaders can’t participate in the wonderful pastime of cast iron cooking and gentle trash talk. Leaders can make a cobbler in their home and show off their skills to other leaders. Even if you do not make one, you can watch the mouth-watering concoctions being revealed. Cobbler bakeoff will start at 7pm on Wednesday.

Vespers

An interfaith worship service will be on Wednesday night at 7:30pm and we invite all faiths to participate in this meaningful service as Scouts show their “duty to God” by participating.

Closing Campfire

On Thursday night, we will wrap up the week with another campfire featuring YOU! The Communication merit badge class will put on the closing campfire using your skits and songs. If you wish to be part of the campfire, turn in your skit/song/performance idea by Monday night and your completed video by Wednesday night. Closing campfire will start at 8pm.

Merit Badge Completion and Partial

At Camp Bud Schiele, the goal for every Scout is to properly earn each merit badge in which the Scout is enrolled. To ensure that each Scout completes each badge in the proper manner, certain merit badge requirements will not be covered online. If a Scout wishes to complete the entire badge while on our virtual camp, it will be necessary for Scouts to complete and provide documentation for a few requirements prior to our virtual summer camp.

We have provided a list of merit badges and the requirements that will not be completed while at virtual summer camp. Scouts are encouraged to complete these before they attend virtual summer camp. A note from the Scoutmaster or other written documentation may be accepted as proof that they have completed these requirements (A Scout is Trustworthy).



Note: The virtual summer camp staff is dedicated to making sure that each scout leaves camp with the knowledge and skills required for each merit badge. Depending upon the instructional needs of the class (i.e. additional time to master skills) scouts may receive partials even if the badge has no prerequisites or if the Scout did not attend class every day.

"All requirements listed as 'homework' in the virtual guide are requirements that cannot be completed during the week of virtual sessions. This is due to time requirements, it is not conducive to virtual lessons, or the materials are not available to the scout to complete during the week. All other requirements will be covered during the virtual lessons and will be earned through completing the workbook and/or doing the activity outside of the virtual session. Instructors will explain throughout the week what is expected to compete the requirements."

Merit Badge Program and Schedule

Merit Badges that are partials are listed as partial. All other badges *can be completed*. All shooting sports badges will be covered online except for the shooting element. Partials can be completed with your local council's Merit Badge Counselor and in some cases, you can follow up with our Council.
